We use "will" for predictions about the future

EX: Sea levels will rise by 2100.

Will I be married and rich in 2030?

We use "will" to talk about future events that are logically expected

EX: The phone is ringing, I'll answer it.

We use "will" when we decide to do something.

EX: I think I will take a holiday in Spain.

And after conditions with "if".

EX: If I have the time, I will go to the cinema.
